Hello cattle people,

It's been a while since there's been a newsletter emailed or posted from Ardcairnie Angus so we thought it was time to touch base in these very different Covid 19 times. We hope you are all managing to stay safe and well; for most of us as farmers, we are used to working from home and "isolating" much of the time so that has made life less stressful for us all.

Livestock farming continues as the year rolls on. Calving started here on 31st March, a couple of weeks earlier than our planned due dates, but that happens. On that first day, three heifers calved bringing four calves with heifer number two having twin bull calves. One of them is now being fostered by heifer number 8 to calve - a dead calf resulting from a very narrow birth canal and a head coming folded back. Our vet Kate managed to relax the heifer and pull the calf - we had thought a caesarean operation would be necessary. Since then, the second calvers who had a fixed time AI programme on 30th July 2019 have kicked into gear, again ahead of their due date of 6th May. Thank heavens for the range of negative EBVs for Days to Calving and Gestation Length that spreads out calving of the these 70 second calvers from one day to close to two weeks!

Sires of the 2020 calves

Calving is always an exciting time to see what the progeny of new AI sires to the Ardcairnie herd look like.

New sires for this 2020 calving include Yon Full Force, Exar Monumental 6056B, Musgrave Mediator, Baldridge 38 Special, Bruin Torque, Bush's Wind Chill, Millah Murrah Nugget N266 and Koojan Hills Kaiser N91.

In addition there are five new paddock sires - four home bred in Ardcairnie N36, Ardcairnie N52, Ardcairnie N285 in the heifer mob, and Ardcairnie N298 and Coonamble Kevin N444 in the cow mob. And again, interesting to see their progeny.

A dry few months?

Maybenup has had one of the longest dry spells we have experienced since we moved here from Denbarker just over 22 years ago. The calendar year of 2019 gave us 265mms (10.5 inches) and that's about half of what the average was in 1998. Since October's 17.5mms, there's been 5 in November, zero in December and January, 17 in February, 11 in March and zero in April. 8mms on 4th May has been followed by 18.5mms this morning in the south gauge; north gauge 5kms had 9mms and then 13mms.

Four dams have been cleaned out, two drains enlarged and one dam needing two excavators still awaits their arrival. Our local contractor has been working all hours around the district. Our furthest east dam is dry so another local contractor is carting water to the tank there to supply the calving heifers with water - there's dry feed in that paddock and a little breakfast of pellets each morning has kept them growing and strong.

The bull sale on 4th February - while there wasn't our usual clearance, prices were good and several bulls have sold since.

There are still 22 available should the need arise through the 2020 mating season. Details included. Check the website to download all the details of the 22.

With our planned grazing management, the number of mobs is kept as few as possible with bull mating time (July, August, September) being the exception when there's 3 mating mobs for 3 weeks, 10 for six weeks and 7 mobs for another three. At the moment, there are 6 mobs all up - calving heifers, calving cows, weaner heifers, weaner bulls, sale bulls and herd bulls (set-stocked). The five mobs are moving round their grazing cells, leaving 79 paddocks with no stock and time to recover and grow - if the rain keeps coming!
